It's Degas! Though Edgar Degas (1834-1917) exhibited with the Impressionists, he separated himself from them in many ways, especially their practice of painting outside--*en plein air*--and is often considered more of a Realist in many ways. His "spontaneous" and seemingly unplanned compositions that look like snapshots are really highly orchestrated and the result of long hours of drawing, studying, and planning. Degas was an excellent draughtsman. You can see six of his works at the Frist Center's exhibition *The Birth of Impressionism: Masterpieces from the Musée d'Orsay*, on view in Nashville through Jan. 23, 2011. LOST RIVER ART FAIR

Growing into something great

ArtWorks hosted the Lost River Art Fair at Lost River Cave in Bowling Green on September 18th. The weather was great and the event was a lot of fun! There were 23 booths and especially popular were the demonstrations given by some of the exhibitors. Local group Watersprite performed, with some help from Mark Whitley. Bill van Tassel, who organized the fair, was happy with the outcome, but said, looking forward to next year, "I think we can build on it." The Lost River Art Fair is gaining a local reputation as a quality site for artists to exhibit, and Van Tassel is already looking for help for next year to make it even better and bigger. The fair awarded three People's Choice prizes, which were won this year by Van Tassel, David Jones, and Laura Bain-Selbo.
